Earn Your Elementary Education Four-Year Degree From SE

Students at GCC can earn their degree in Elementary Education from Southeastern Oklahoma State University without, in many cases, ever leaving the Grayson County College campus in Denison, Texas.

The courses are taught on-site at Grayson by SE professors and quality adjunct instructors, supplemented by online instruction.

Elementary Education classes will be offered in a Monday-Friday late afternoon or evening format.

This collaborative effort is approved from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, the Grayson County College Board of Trustees and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

Founded in 1909 and based in Durant, Southeastern has a branch campus in McCurtain County in Oklahoma, serves higher education centers in Ardmore and McAlester, OK, and delivers aviation programs in Durant, at Tinker AFB, and at Oklahoma City Community College.

How do I apply for admission?

You can apply for online admission at www.SE.edu and use your credit card to pay the \$20 application fee. Or, you can use a paper application by printing it off from www.SE.edu/future-students/admissions-application and mailing it to the indicated address. Mattie McClenny in the GCC Student Center will also assist you in getting the paperwork. Mattie can be reached at 903-463-8701.

Where and when is enrollment?

All students must be advised prior to enrollment; contact Mattie McClenny in the GCC Student Center to schedule your advising appointment. If you have already applied, been admitted and met with your advisor, you can complete enrollment by accessing www.SE.edu and registering for classes through Campus Connect. Enrollment periods are listed at www.SE.edu/registrar/enrollment-information.

Am I considered a Grayson student or a Southeastern student?

You are a Southeastern student. If you are receiving financial aid, you will receive it from Southeastern. All tuition and fees will be paid to Southeastern, except the GCC parking permit; you cannot use your SE financial aid at SE to pay your GCC fees. You will register and attend classes according to Southeastern’s Academic calendar www.SE.edu/registrar/calendar.

When and where are the classes held?

The classes are held on the main campus of Grayson County College in Denison, TX. Elementary Education classes are offered in a Monday through Thursday late afternoon and evening format.

Who are the instructors?

Instructors include a combination of regular School of Education and Behavioral Sciences faculty from SE’s Durant campus and qualified adjunct faculty. Instruction is face to face with some supplemental online instruction.

Do I have access to facilities at both SE and GCC campus?

Yes, you will have access to facilities at both Grayson and Southeastern in Durant.

Will I ever need to attend classes on the Durant campus?

All courses for the undergraduate Elementary Education program are offered at GCC campus or on-line. This does not rule out the possibility that a student might take courses on both campuses, if desired.

Is dual enrollment (GCC & SE) possible?

Yes—if you lack required courses to complete your Associates degree at Grayson, it is possible to enroll in classes from both institutions simultaneously.

If I am working on my associates' degree at Grayson and am planning to be an Elementary Education major through the Southeastern at Grayson program, what should my associate's degree be in?

The recently revised Associates of Arts in Early Childhood Education meets all 2+2 requirements for articulation with Southeastern. Students with other associate degrees may also apply, but will need to see an adviser to plan their degree program. Am I eligible for the Southeastern at Grayson program if I have an Associates degree from a school other than Grayson?

Yes. We have set up 2+2 programs with several community colleges. See www.SE.edu/2plus2.

How do I qualify for financial aid?

You may make application for financial aid through the Financial Aid office at Southeastern. For general information, visit www.SE.edu/financial-aid. What are the tuition and fees for the Southeastern at Grayson program?

For the academic year 2008-09 the Southeastern at Grayson undergraduate rates *per credit hour* are found at:

You will also be required to purchase a GCC Parking Sticker for the Academic Year. Remember, you cannot use your SE financial aid to pay for your GCC fees.

Southeastern has non-resident tuition waiver policies that are available to Texas residents, one of which is based on Grade Point Average (GPA.) During the first two semesters at Southeastern, 100% of the non-resident tuition is waived. Subsequent semesters, students may continue to receive non-resident tuition waivers based on SE retention/graduation GPA using the following scale:

GPA:	Percent of non-resident tuition waived:
3.50—4.00	100%
3.00—3.49	90%
2.00—2.99	75%

Students transferring to Southeastern who already have an Associates of Science Degree from a community college may apply for the Transfer Associates Tuition Waiver. Southeastern will provide a 100% non-resident tuition waiver for your first two semesters. To receive the award for two additional semesters, you must meet or exceed fulltime enrollment requirements (12 semester hours each semester), and stay in good academic standing within your degree program. Application for this waiver is required and is available at www.SE.edu/scholarship-application.

Texas school personnel may receive a 100% non-resident tuition waiver. To ensure receipt, you must provide a letter signed by a school official, verifying your Texas school employment, to Southeastern’s Office of Student Financial Aid before the last day to enroll or add a class.
