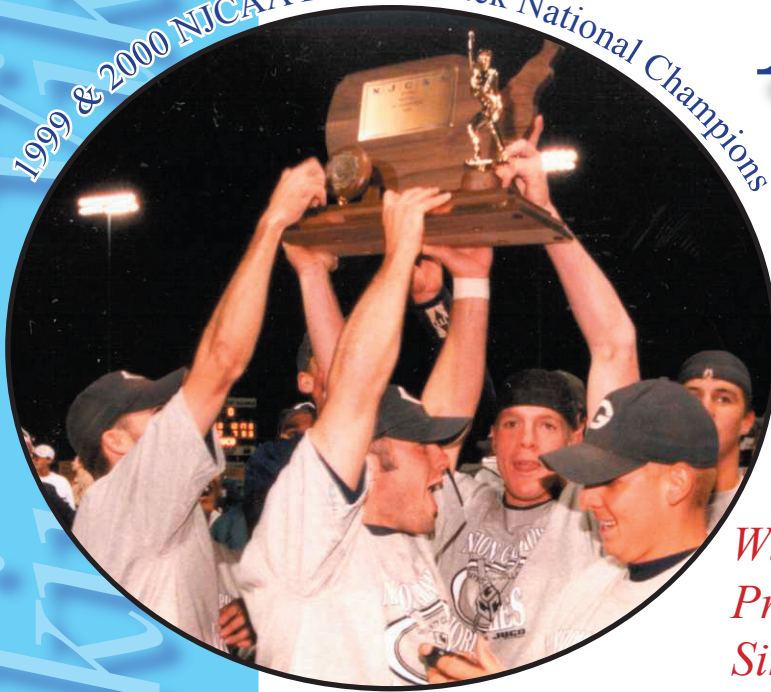

The history of GCC's baseball program is both long and short. After 20 years without baseball as a varsity sport, Grayson County College resurrected the Vikings Baseball program in 1996. By 1998, GCC had already made a significant mark in the ranks of college baseball and have since taken the National Junior College World Series by storm.

The 1999 team won the NJCAA national title in record style - undefeated; the first team to do so in the record books. Not to be known as a one-time

wonder, the 2000 team returned to the JUCO World Series and again captured the national title. GCC is only the 6th school in the history of the tournament to win back-to-back championships.

While the GCC program has enjoyed national attention, so have many of the players who have had opportunities to move into university and professional play. Many young men have signed professional contracts, and many more have received 4-year university scholarships.
