

SUMMARY

Upon completion of these CDEC and TECA courses, the core courses and the remaining major course at Grayson College, the student will have completed their AAS and will be ready to transfer to a university.

CERTIFICATE

These three classes are the Child Development Occupational Skills Award. They are three classes that area also part of the Child Development Certificate and the AAS, both of which can be completed once the student graduates high school and continues their education at Grayson College.

INSTRUCTOR

A credentialed high school teacher embedded at the school or a credentialed professor from Grayson College.

CURRICULUM

Curriculum is provided by Grayson College and consists of materials located in the Canvas Learning Management System and hands-on lab activities.

SCHEDULE

Students complete tier coursework online and required hours in a laboratory setting. Students will be required to complete 2-3 hours of observation at their chosen site per week. Students will need to coordinate with the school or child care center as to when they can complete their required hours each week.

FACILITY

Courses are offered online. Field experience is done in local child care centers or public school Pre-K through grade 3 classes if required in the course.

TSI REQUIREMENT

Must be TSI complete in Reading and Writing for CDEC and TECA classes.

PREREQUISITES

None.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENT

State law requires that students under the age of 22 who will attend classes on a GC campus must provide documentation of a meningococcal vaccination within the previous 5 years or a conscientious objection waiver. Students will not be enrolled without this documentation.
