SUMMARY

Completing these credentials enables students to enter the workplace and fast-track their career in Health care. Upon successful completion students should be prepared for employment as a Certified Nurse Aide and/or a Patient Care Tech. Both are excellent preparation for working a long-term career in Healthcare. Students will also learn about Phlebotomy, and can test for the Phlebotomy certification.

CURRICULUM

The hybrid curriculum is provided by Grayson College and consists of materials located in the Canvas Learning Management System and is complemented by hands-on lab activities on a Grayson College Campus (Main).

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

High School students must be at least 17 years of age prior to clinicals starting. Students must successfully pass a drug test which will be administered at a mandatory orientation the first day of class. Drug tests may be repeated throughout the program. Failure of a drug test will make the student not eligible for the program.

The following immunizations are required and must be fully completed and Submitted to SURSCAN PRIOR TO THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS. Information about this process will be sent to the student via their counselors.

- Varicella (Chicken Pox), Proof of either:
 - two documented doses of varicella immunization
 - or a titer test (blood test) confirming immunity
- Hepatitis B series, Proof of either:
 - a complete three-injection series of Hepatitis B vaccinations,
 - a complete two-injection series of Heplisav
 - a titer test confirming immunity (positive reading)
- MMR series, Proof of either:
 - a complete two-injection series of MMR vaccinations, or
 - a titer test confirming immunity (positive reading)

- Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis (TDAP) (within past 10 years)
 - DTAP or TD not acceptable
- Meningococcal Vaccine proof of:
 - one dose of the vaccine within 5 years and at least 10 days prior to the first day of class
- Influenza Vaccine (the most recent variation)
- TB Exam: Obtain proof of a negative TB (tuberculosis) test. Blood or skin test must be within one year, negative chest x-rays must be within five years.

Students should have reliable transportation to and from campus and the clinical sites

SCHEDULE

Students complete online coursework, hands-on lab skills practice and clinical hours in healthcare settings. Students will register for their mandatory in class sessions and clinical practicums, which will take place in various facilities in Grayson County.

- Monday-Thursday, 1-3pm in HS 215 (Attendance on campus is required for class sessions)
- Monday-Thursday, 2-4pm in HS 213 (Attendance on campus is required for class sessions)

In person sessions will be offered at Grayson College Main Campus, Health Sciences building.

ATTENDANCE

Students who miss more than 15% of total program hours are ineligible for program completion and will receive a failing grade. The only exception being school sponsored events. Students can not have more than one clinical absence.

FACILITY

Classes are delivered in a hybrid format, with students completing some coursework online, and the skills lab and clinical components are delivered face-to-face at the Denison campus and various clinical locations in Grayson County.

TEXTBOOK & SUPPLIES

Included in tuition are licensure exams, textbooks, study guides, background checks and drug testing. Students will be given instructions the first day of class as to what scrubs to purchase.
