General Overview of Program

The RN to BSN program is a post-licensure baccalaureate program designed to enhance the knowledge of a registered nurse. The program is built to serve the workforce needs of the community and align with the current mission of Grayson College. The program aims to prepare the graduate to advance his/her career in professional nursing in a variety of health-related settings. A central focus of the program is on the continued development of an RN as a member of the profession, provider of patient-centered care, patient safety advocate, and member of the healthcare team.

The courses are offered in a hybrid format, meaning online courses with minimal on-campus requirements. There will be one on-campus orientation day each 8-week term for each course offered that term, and one on-campus class day at the end of term for each course. There will be three total on-campus class days (orientation, middle class day and final class day) for the 16-week courses, Health Assessment for the RN and Professional Project. We designed these on-campus meetings to minimize the need for a nurse to take off multiple days from work to attend school. We post the schedule in the RN-BSN Student Success Course in Canvas at least 8 weeks in advance and also post to each individual course in Canvas. During Covid-19 disruption, please consult your Canvas courses for instructions on any changes in class times.

- Proof of current, unencumbered licensure as a Registered Nurse

- Application to Grayson College (online at <u>www.grayson.edu</u>). Applicants must be fully admitted to Grayson College in order to be eligible for consideration into the RN-BSN program.
- 2. Completion of the Health Science Division Application for Admission to the RN-BSN program (included)
- 3. Completion of the Verification Statement form, Credit Award Policy form (included) 4. College GPA (cumulative) minimum of 2.5. If the cumulative GPA is less than 2.5, the applicant must submit a written request for a waiver
- 5. Current, unencumbered license to practice as a Registered Nurse
- 6. Must be able to meet immunization requirements and all other requirements of the practicum facility, prior to completing practicum hours.

Technology Requirements

Students enrolled in the RN-BSN program are required to access Canvas since the program is delivered in a hybrid, online format. Canvas is a learning management system (LMS) used for online, blended, and face-to-face classes at Grayson College. Canvas provides a method to deliver a variety of course content along with a means for faculty to interact with students. A computer with an internet connection is needed. Canvas may be accessed on campus or off campus. Computers for student use are available in the Health Science Computer Lab, the Grayson College Library, and other campus computer laboratories. Library hours are posted on the Grayson College website and the Health Science Computer Lab hours are posted outside the lab each semester. Students will be oriented to the use of Canvas and other Health Science technologies at the beginning of each nursing course.

Credit award is accomplished on a course by-course basis. A grade of "P" will be given for the courses earned through credit award. No grade points are associated with the grade of "P." No fee will be charged for any credit award transactions.

Although credit award may count toward hours needed for graduation at Grayson College, other institutions are not obligated to accept credit awarded, because each institution sets its own policy regarding credit awards. Accordingly, students transferring credit awarded at other institutions must meet Grayson College's credit award requirements for the credit to be posted at Grayson College.
