Our Program

The Associate Degree Surgical Technology program is a traditional 3 semester program, not including the pre-requisite and corequisite courses. This is a full-time, in-person program with clinical requirements and possibly some online components. Graduating students will be eligible to sit for the NBSTSA exam.

A competitive admissions process is required in addition to applying to the College. Applications are accepted once a year, and up to 24 students are accepted each admissions period.

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GENERAL PROGRAM INFORMATION

Association of Surgical Technologists AST

The Grayson College Associate Degree Surgical Technology program is a 3-semester program. Surgical Technology courses are separated into three semesters, two 16 weeks and one 10-week semester.

Students will begin attending clinical the second 8 weeks during the fall, unless otherwise indicated by the Grayson College Surgical Technology Department. Students can choose to take speech and art during program however be advised the courses in program are time consuming with a large amount of homework. Do not overload yourself, we want you to be successful.

Minimum Expectations

Accepted students should plan to be in class or clinical approximately three days a week for the entirety of the program. There are approximately 8 hours of lecture content and lab class per day with 12-18 hours of clinical per week. These vary from semester to semester, but students will most likely be in class or clinical three days a week throughout the three semesters.

Services are available to assist students with various needs. Professionally trained counselors are available to all students and are prepared to assist students in achieving success. A wide variety of counseling and support services are available. For example, a Foreign and ESOL Student Advisor is available to assist international students with a wide variety of needs.

Program Goals and Outcomes

The Surgical Technology students will receive instruction in the fundamentals of all sterile processing and surgical technology areas. The program goals and learning outcomes are "To prepare competent entry-level surgical technologist in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains." To complement academic training, the student will rotate through area hospitals. This will help the student to develop his/her surgical technology skills previously learned in the classroom/lab and the corresponding application to actual patient care. A student may be sent to any facility where Grayson College has a current affiliation agreement. Clinical assignments will be made by consultation between the Program Director and Clinical Coordinator. Exceptions to assignments or changes in assignments will only be made in extreme circumstances or at the facility's request. Only students with satisfactory standing in Surgical Technology (SRGT) coursework will be eligible to begin clinical training.

- To prepare students to complete the Surgical Technologist National Certifying Examination conducted by the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting.
- To prepare competent entry-level surgical technologists in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains.
- To provide the community with professional, competent, desirable employees and entry-level Surgical Technologists.
- To prepare students to function as a part of the healthcare profession.
- To prepare students to function professionally, caring, and ethically when providing patient care.

Clinical Requirements

- Students may be exposed to possible infectious diseases.
- Will be standing in one place for long periods of time.
- Clinical sites locations in: 50-mile radius from the main college in Denison, TX.
- Students will be placed at a different clinical site every semester.
- 120 surgical cases must be obtained to graduate the program and eligible to sit for exam.
- Reliable transportation is required.
- Be prepared to have a plan A, B, and C to accommodate life situations.

Technology Requirements

Students should have access to Internet off-campus in order to complete online coursework and requirements. A laptop or tablet with a camera or webcam and speakerphone will also be required.

Students enrolled in the Program are required to access a learning management system (LMS) used for on line, blended, and face-to-face classes at Grayson College. A computer with an Internet connection is needed. Computers for student use are available in the Health Science Computer Lab, the Grayson College Library, and other campus computer laboratories. Students will be oriented to the use of LMS on Monday prior to semester starting in Fall.

- 4. Applicants are required to be fully or conditionally admitted to be considered for the program

Application

Required Documents

- Completed Application
- Typed 1-2 pages covering the following topics:
 - 1. What makes you a strong candidate for the surgical technology program
 - 2. What is the biggest challenge you will face during the program
- Transcripts (unofficial of ALL colleges attended)

Applications must be submitted to <u>surgtech@grayson.edu</u>. Documents must be scanned and uploaded no back ground behind documents. CamScanner is an app you can use to professionally scan and send documents by pdf. Paper copies of documents will not be accepted in person or by mail. Applicants are responsible for ensuring updated documents are received by our office by the application deadline.

The Surgical Technology Department retains the right to deny applications or documents it deems incomplete, ineligible, or illegible at the department's discretion. **The applicant is responsible for ensuring their application is complete, eligible, submitted, and received by our office by the posted deadlines.** It is recommended that applicants check their emails frequently throughout this process.

Admission Requirements

- High School Diploma/GED
- Admitted to Grayson College
- Attendance of Information Session
- 2.0 GPA in all prerequisite courses
- HESI Surgical Technology Exam (must pass each section with a 70)
- All science course work completed within 5 years

Selection and Acceptance Procedure

- 1. All applications are reviewed by the Surgical Technology Committee after the application deadline. Applicants with completed files (including prerequisite courses) will be considered first.
- 2. Applicants will complete an interview with program faculty
- 3. The number of students admitted to the program varies dependent on clinical space, classroom availability and faculty availability. Admission selection is based on a points system and the scholastic readiness of the applicant which is derived from all documents submitted. (See the

following scoring system)

4. A decision email will be sent to each applicant via their Vikings email whether it be for acceptance, wait list or non-accepted. An acceptance list and wait list will be used until courses begin. Applicants on the wait list will be notified by phone and email if offered a seat in the class. Number of applicants on the wait list and their position on the wait list will not be disclosed.

Coursework Evaluation

It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure applicable courses are eligible to transfer and meet equivalency before they apply. To ensure the transferability of previous coursework completed at colleges and universities other than Grayson College, potential applicants to nursing programs are encouraged to have their coursework evaluated by the Health Science Department at least one semester prior to a program application filing deadline if possible. This procedure is especially important for students with coursework from colleges and universities outside the state of Texas. Applicants must be fully admitted GC students for final/official transcript evaluations.

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA Courses

Pre-Requisites:

Courses must be completed with a 'C' or higher and the most recent earned grade will be counted. Required to be completed by the application deadline date.

Pre-requisites in progress may be considered if completed by start date of Fall Semester.

Co-Requisites:

Courses must be completed with a 'C' or higher and the most recent grade will be counted. Required to be completed by the end of the program in order to graduate.

Courses not completed by the application deadline will not count towards point calculation.

Minimum GPA

A minimum 2.0 GPA calculated either for pre-requisites or as cumulative is required by the application deadline in order to be eligible for that admissions period.

Transcripts

Prior to applying to a health occupations program, potential applicants must have submitted official transcripts from each higher educational institution attended to the Registrar/Admissions Office after applying to be a Grayson College student and be fully or conditionally admitted to Grayson College for the health science application to be considered.

The transcripts must be updated with the print date current within two years of the applicant's anticipated admission to the program.

If fully admitted into Grayson College, students can print off official transcripts from their MyViking Document Tracking tab. Grayson College transcripts can be printed off from your My Transcripts tab.

Transfer Process

Applicants need to have all transcripts reviewed to ensure the course will transfer. Any student currently working in the healthcare field will receive points during interview.

REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS, DRUG SCREEN, AND BACKGROUND CHECKS

All applicants accepted into the program will be required to have the listed immunizations. **Do Not submit immunizations or health records** with your application. However, it is HIGHLY recommended that applicants begin the process of obtaining these records and getting any missing vaccinations. Please note that some of these immunizations take up to six months to complete. Immunizations must be started in time to complete the series before the start of the program. *During orientation, the accepted applicants will receive instruction of how to subscribe and upload documents into an immunization and health records tracking program.*

- 1. **TETANUS/DIPHTHERIA/PERTUSSIS (Tdap):** (Immunization) One dose of Tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis (Tdap) immunization within the last 10 years (DTAP or TD not accepted).
- 2. **MEASLES, MUMPS, RUBELLA (MMR):** (Immunizations or blood test) 2 doses.
- 3. VARICELLA (Chickenpox): (Immunization or blood test) 2 doses.
- 4. **HEPATITIS B (3 dose series) or Heplislav B (2 dose series):** (Immunization or blood test) Takes 1-4 months to complete.
- 5. **MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE:** All on-campus college students who are *under the age of 22 must* have the meningococcal vaccination within the previous 5 years and at least 10 days prior to the first day of class.
- 6. **INFLUENZA VACCINE:** Annual influenza vaccination with the most up-to- date strains predicted on the basis of viral surveillance data is required.
- 7. **COVID VACCINE:** Grayson College does not require the COVID Vaccine. However, clinical agencies do require COVID Vaccination. Medical and religious waivers are considered. Requirements are subject to change at any time.

Vaccines

Applicants must be able to complete all required immunizations and health documents by orientation, if accepted to the program.

Drug Test and Background Check

Students must pass a urine drug screen and an additional criminal background check at the beginning of the program and prior to the start of clinicals.

Health Documents

CPR: Obtain American Red Cross BLS Healthcare Provider level CPR certification. All CPR classes must include a skills performance check-off in the course (current within 2 years). Our Center for Workforce Learning department offers CPR courses throughout the year, please email them at cwl@grayson.edu for their availability.

TB exam: Obtain proof of a negative TB (tuberculosis) test. Bloodwork or skin test must be current within 1 year, or negative chest x-ray that is current within 5 yrs.

Physical Exam: Required form provided with acceptance/waitlisted email (current within 1 year).

NON-ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Clinical participation is an integral component to completion of required objectives of the Surgical Technology program. In order to participate in this clinical component, students must be able to meet the following requirements.

Physical/Mental Capabilities

- 1. Visual acuity with or without aids
- 2. Hearing ability with/without auditory aids
- 3. Physical ability to stand for prolonged periods of time, perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation, lift at the amount required by the clinical agencies, and move from room to room or maneuver in limited spaces.
- 4. Ability to communicate effectively in verbal and written form. Ability to speak clearly and succinctly when explaining treatment procedures, describing patient conditions, and implementing health teaching. Ability to write legibly and correctly in patient's chart for legal documentation.
- 5. Manual dexterity to use sterile techniques, insert catheters, pass instruments, or retract
- 6. Ability to function safely under stressful conditions, adapting to ever-changing clinical situations involving patient care.

Clinical Participation Eligibility (Criminal Background Check policy)

Based on clinical agency requirements, and in accordance with the Grayson College Health Science Criminal Background Check Policy, any student with the following criminal history will be required to obtain a Declaratory Order prior to admission to the program.

- 1. Felony convictions
- 2. Misdemeanor convictions, misdemeanor deferred adjudications, or felony deferred adjudications involving crimes against persons (physical or sexual abuse)
- Misdemeanor convictions related to moral turpitude (prostitution, public 4 07/2019 lewdness/exposure, theft under \$1,500, computer crimes of fraud, etc.)
- **4.** Felony deferred adjudications for the sale, possession, distribution, or transfer of narcotics or controlled substances
- 5. Registered sex offenders
- 6. OIG, GSA and Medicaid Sanctions
- 7. Terrorist Suspect List
- 8. Pending charges and warrants for arrest.

The following convictions at any time in the past will constitute an absolute bar to participation in clinical rotations:

Criminal homicide; kidnapping and unlawful restraint; indecency with a child; sexual assault; aggravated assault; injury to a child; aiding suicide; agreement to abduct from custody; sale or purchase of a child; arson; robbery; aggravated robbery; conviction under the law of another state, federal law, or the uniform Code of Military Justice for an offense containing elements that are substantially similar to the elements of an offense listed previously; felony conviction for theft which occurred within the previous five years and any other offense that a facility may impose.

All applicants must submit to and pay for the Department of Public Safety/Federal Bureau of Investigation background check PRIOR to final admission to any surgical technology program. **This must be provided by the scheduled orientation date.**

- 1. convicted of a felony?
- 2. pled nolo contendere, no contest, or guilty?
- 3. received deferred adjudication?
- **4.** been placed on community supervision or court-ordered probation, whether or not adjudicated guilty?
- 5. been sentenced to serve jail or prison time? court-ordered confinement?
- 6. been granted pre-trial diversion?
- 7. been cited or charged with any violation of the law?
- **8.** been subject of a court-martial; Article 15 violation; or received any form of military judgment, punishment, action?

NOTE: Expunged and Sealed Offenses:

While expunged or sealed offenses, arrests, tickets, or citations need not be disclosed, it is your responsibility to ensure the offense, arrest, ticket or citation has, in fact, been expunged or sealed. It is recommended that you submit a copy of the Court Order expunging or sealing the record in question to our office with your application. Non-disclosure of relevant offenses raises questions related to truthfulness and character.
